Compulsory Language Requirements for Exchange Students	<p>To be accepted for admission to Niagara University you must be able to speak, read, write, and understand English at a level that will allow you to successfully complete your college work at Niagara University. Students participating in a one or two semester exchange program with Niagara University must have test scores for review from TOEFL, IELTS, Cambridge Certificate of Proficiency in English (CPE), or Cambridge Certificate in Advanced English (CAE). A score report from any one of the above English Language Proficiency tests may be sent <u>directly</u> to Niagara University. Use our Institutional Code Number 2558. This requirement is waived if your native language is English or if you have two years of college level coursework in English.</p> <p>The language requirements are: TOEFL: 79+, IELTS: 6.0+, CET6: 450+, or CET4: 475+</p>
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When will the transcript be released?	Approximately 2 weeks after completion of exams/semester. Student must request a transcript from the records office to be sent to their home university. This can be done by visiting www.niagara.edu/records .

Climate :	Niagara Falls experiences cold, sometimes snowy winters and hot, often humid summers. Precipitation is moderate and consistent in all seasons, falling equally or more as snow during the winter. The city has snowier than average winters compared to most cities in the USA, however less than many other cities in Upstate New York including nearby Buffalo and Rochester. Thaw cycles with temperatures above 0°C (32°F) are a common occurrence. The hottest and coldest temperatures recorded in the past decade were 97°F (36°C) in 2005 and -13°F (-25°C) in 2003, respectively. 38% of warm season precipitation falls in the form of a thunderstorm.
